## <u>Minutes of the Meeting of Women Parliamentarians in Africa and</u> the Arab World

On Friday, February 16, 2024, at the headquarters of the House of Councilors of the Kingdom of Morocco, a meeting was held for women parliamentarians in Africa and the Arab world under the theme "Empowering Women Parliamentarians to Support Development and Good Governance in Africa and the Arab World."

- -H.E Ms. Amal Essalabi, a member of the High Council of State of Libya, was elected as Rapporteur for the Arab world.
- -H.E Ms. Kandia Kamara, the President of the Senate of Ivory Coast, was elected as Rapporteur for Africa (Appointed her deputy Senator DIABY Makani to this position).
